
## ANOTHER SUCCESSFUL WINGS OVER SWISSVALE

The revitalized Swissvale Crime Watch had its first meeting on September 10, 2013 at 7 p.m. The turn-out for the meeting was small. We need to get residents involved in the community to help our Police Department lessen the crime in Swissvale. Swissvale has a great Police Department and the Police cannot be everywhere to prevent the crime. This is where the Residents come in. We can help extend the eyes and ears of the Police Department by keeping an eye out for suspicious activity, suspicious persons and suspicious vehicles. When anything suspicious is seen, report it to the police by calling 911. Don't hesitate and think someone else will call, make the call yourself and report what was seen (you can always remain anonymous). ## SWISSVALE FIRE DEPARTMENT RECEIVES NEW ISO-PPC RATING



ISO CLASS 3

The Insurance Service Office (ISO) recently issued a new Public Protection Class (PPC) rating for Swissvale. The department has shown significant improvements since its last evaluation.

The PPC Program evaluates public fire protection services and provides an objective, countrywide standard that classifies a community's ability to suppress fires. ISO analyzes the relevant data using their Fire Suppression Rating Schedule (FSRS) and assigns a Public Protection Classification from 1 to 10. Class 1 generally represents superior property fire protection, and Class 10 indicates that the area's fire-suppression program doesn't meet ISO's minimum criteria.

ISO's PPC program evaluates communities according to a uniform set of criteria, incorporating nationally recognized standards developed by the National Fire Protection Association and the American Water Works Association. So, the PPC program provides a useful benchmark that helps fire departments and other public officials measure the effectiveness of their efforts.

Swissvale Fire Department underwent their evaluation in June and the new ISO-PPC rating for Swissvale is a Class 3, down from a Class 5. The new score was 75.09, up from 50.11. While the overall score increased 48.85%, the portion of the scoring directly related to the fire department's operations increased 70.70%.

In Allegheny County's 130 municipalities, only one department is rated better: The City of Pittsburgh, which was rated a Class 2 just a few years ago. Swissvale joins two other communities at the Class 3 level: Mt Lebanon and Scott Township. And based on that last statewide survey provided by ISO in the report; of the state's 2,584 communities to receive a PPC rating, there is only one class 1, two Class 2's and 22 Class 3 communities. This puts the Swissvale Fire Department's "report card" in the top 1% of Pennsylvania's communities.

Virtually all U.S. insurers of homes and business property use ISO's Public Protection Classifications in calculating premiums. In general, the price of insurance in a community with a good PPC is substantially lower than in a community with a poor PPC, assuming all other factors are equal.

Fire Chief Clyde Wilhelm congratulated his firefighters on their new rating. "This new rating is a result of the collective efforts of all the members of the department. This accomplishment is something they all should be proud of." The Chief also noted the department will be working on lowering their rating to a Class 2 by 2015.
