### *A Message From the Borough Manager*

It was great to see everyone at our Annual Community Days. We hope everyone had a great time and enjoyed all the activities, music and fireworks! I would like to thank Mayor Swartzwelder and the Community Days Volunteers for all their hard work in making this event a success.

Here are some of the things happening in the Borough:

We recently were awarded a \$100,000 CITF Grant towards the demolition of several properties. One building on Monongahela Avenue, several on South Braddock Avenue and possibly a few on Noble Street will be demolished as a result this fall. I would like to thank Senator Jay Costa and Representative Paul Costa for help in getting this grant.

The Collingwood Park Rehabilitation Project has been completed. There is more information on this in the newsletter.

The Pedestrian Crosswalk Safety Improvement Project at South Braddock and Sanders Street was awarded recently to A. Folino Construction. This work should commence in the near future and work will be done in the evenings starting at 7 p.m. to avoid traffic congestion issues.

The Borough Civil Service Commission recently tested police officer candidates. The Borough plans to hire two new full time officers this fall to fill vacancies created through retirements.

### **STREET LIGHT SERVICE REQUESTS**

Street lights throughout the borough are maintained by Duquesne Light. If you see lights that are out or do not remain on, please contact Duquesne Light's customer service at 412-393-7100.

Make sure you write down the pole number (found on a small metal tab on the post) or have a clear address of where the pole is located. The automated phone system will guide you through a series of easy-to-follow steps. Duquesne Light should come out within a few days.

**ALLEGHENY COUNTY VACANT  
PROPERTY RECOVERY PROGRAM  
PROVIDES OPPORTUNITY TO  
ACQUIRE SIDE YARD PROPERTIES OR  
VACANT STRUCTURES IN SWISSVALE.**

For a limited time only, the Allegheny County Vacant Property Recovery Program will be accepting applications to acquire vacant properties for side yards to an owner-occupied primary residence or blighted structure remediation at a reduced cost to the applicant.

Under the 2018 Side Yard and Blighted Structure Program, they will waive the standard parcel fee of \$3,000 for applicants for a side yard to their primary residence and applicants proposing to demolish a blighted structure. They will reduce the fee to \$1,400 for applicants proposing to rehabilitate a blighted structure. All applicants will also be responsible for the appraised value of the property, a good faith deposit, and closing costs.

The application, which contains additional details about the Program guidelines, can be accessed at: [www.alleghenycounty.us/VPRP](http://www.alleghenycounty.us/VPRP) and are also available at [www.swissvaleborough.com](http://www.swissvaleborough.com).

All applications must be post-marked by August 31, 2018. Only one application will be accepted per applicant. The VPRP will accept only 5 applications from any single municipality. However, they may increase these limits at their discretion.

All applications that are pre-screened eligible and complete will be forwarded to the municipality for consideration of the applicant's proposed re-use plan. Please note that in cases where an applicant is proposing to demolish a structure, the applicant must obtain a letter of support from the municipality verifying that the structure presents a safety hazard.

Summer is finally here and the Swissvale Department of Public Works has been busy with a variety of projects. The annual Clean-Up day was held on May 19. Approximately 40 volunteers walked the business district and neighborhoods picking up trash and beautifying the area. At the same time as the clean-up, almost 400 residents dropped off hard to recycle items at Memorial Park. Over 20,000 pounds of televisions, 9,000 pounds of computers and other electronics, 12,000 pounds of paints, oils and hazardous liquids, 500 tires and almost 30,000 pounds of bulk trash were collected. The entire cost of this program was paid for by Swissvale Borough with no out of pocket expense to the residents.

The DPW has begun undertaking annual maintenance projects and necessary repairs throughout the borough as a result of our harsh winter. Asphalt patching of main streets is underway. Alleys will be attended to in the coming weeks. We have also begun painting crosswalks throughout the business district and neighborhoods and will continue to do so as the weather permits. Other projects on the horizon include repairs to storm and sanitary sewers, continuation of repairs to brick streets, tree pruning and removals, ongoing park maintenance and grass cutting at over 120 vacant and abandoned lots throughout the borough.

We are excited that the renovation of Collingwood Park has been completed. The improvements included the resurfacing of the entire lot and surrounding sidewalks as well as installation of a new pavilion, new benches, new trash receptacles and basketball courts and fencing. Improvements were also made to the play structure including a new swing set and safety mulch zone.

Since the Department of Public Works will be working on a variety of planned and emergency projects throughout the summer, please slow down in work zones and help to ensure worker safety.

## SUMMER BICYCLE SAFETY

With the arrival of summer, the use of bicycles increases greatly. Below are just a few of the rules, regulations and safety tips for operating a bicycle on the roadways of Pennsylvania. If you ride in violation of traffic laws, you greatly increase your risk of a crash and will likely be found at fault in the event of an accident.



## Bicycling Safety Rules and Regulations

### Equipment

- If you use your bike between sunset and sunrise, it must be equipped with a front lamp and rear and side reflectors that are visible from at least 500 feet. This is both to help other motorists see you and also to illuminate your path.

### Sidewalks

- Pedestrians have the right-of-way on sidewalks and bicycle paths. You must give an audible signal as you approach and pass a pedestrian.
- You are not permitted to ride a bicycle on a sidewalk in a business district (except where permitted by official traffic control devices) or where there is a bicycle-only lane available.

### Helmets

- Anyone under the age of 12 must wear a helmet when riding a bicycle. This applies to anyone operating the bicycle, riding as a passenger, or riding in an attached restraining seat or trailer. The Pennsylvania Department of Transportation strongly recommends that all bicyclists wear helmets whenever they ride.

### Traffic Signals

- All traffic signals must be obeyed in accordance with standard vehicle laws.**

## Bicycling Safety Recommendations

- Always wear a helmet.
- Obey traffic laws.
- Obey stop signs and red lights.
- Never ride against the flow of traffic.
- Be predictable:
  - Ride in a straight line with at least one hand on the handlebars.
  - Check to be sure your path is clear and change directions without swerving.
  - Use hand signals to indicate when you are turning.
- Make yourself visible:
  - Consider wearing bright cycling clothes.
  - Put reflectors on your wheels and on the front and rear of your bike.
  - At night, a front light and rear reflector are required.

## NINE MILE RUN WATERSHED ASSOCIATION

### At Nine Mile Run Watershed Association, we love our dogs!

We love walking our dogs along Nine Mile Run, as many of you might. Here are a few things to keep in mind during your visit.

1. Be a part of the clean water solution! The Nine Mile Run Stormwater Partnership is advocating for all of our dog-loving residents to help keep the stream clean by picking up after your furry friend. Why? A single gram of dog poop contains 23 million fecal coliform bacteria. That bacteria can cause Giardia, Salmonellosis and so much more. By picking up after your dog, you help prevent that bacteria from being washed into the stream (either in the park or through the storm drains in your neighborhood). Take the Pups 4 Clean Water pledge at [alcosan.org](http://alcosan.org)!
2. Leash your dogs. If your dog's on a leash, you're more likely to know where to pick up after them. Plus, having your pups stick to the path helps preserve the wildlife our Urban Ecostewards work so hard to protect! Also, it's an Allegheny County ordinance to leash your dogs, for the safety of your dog and others.
3. Don't let your dogs drink the water! While it's tempting to let your dogs take a drink in the stream during a hot day, the water is not safe to drink. Due to our region's combined sewer system, more than 1/10th of an inch of rain causes sewage-contained stormwater to enter Nine Mile Run, in addition to other streams and rivers. NMRWA is doing our part by installing green stormwater infrastructure around the watershed to hold back some of the stormwater and keep it from overflowing, but there is more to be done. Stay safe, and keep yourself and your pets out of the stream, especially after it rains.

**STEVE SLUZYSKY**


